New law means the price of alcohol is changing on the 4th January 2022

The Irish Government is introducing this to reduce alcohol use and alcohol harm.

All alcohol will now have a minimum price and it will be illegal to sell it any cheaper.

EXAMPLES OF MINIMUM PRICES ARE:



Cider 6% alcohol 500ml can

€2.37



Vodka

37.5% alcohol 200ml naggin

€5.92



Wine

12% alcohol 750ml bottle

€7.10



Whiskey

40% alcohol 700ml bottle

€22.09

If you are a frequent user and are cutting down or stopping alcohol use, contact your GP for advice. This is so you can cut back safely and avoid withdrawal symptoms.

COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES FUND

Tipperary County Council recently launched a new scheme called The Community Activities Fund to support community groups in Tipperary. The total amount of funding granted to Tipperary by the Department of Rural And Community Development was €199,381. 206 community groups around the county will benefit from the scheme, which supports community and voluntary groups impacted by Covid-19. This once-off fund was allocated under the Department's Community Enhancement Programme (CEP) and it will be administered by Tipperary Local Community Development Committee (LCDC).

The Community Activities Fund will support groups, particularly in disadvantaged areas, with their running costs such as utility (electricity, heating charges) or insurance bills, as well as with improvements to their facilities.

Groups will also be able to use the funding to carry out necessary repairs and to purchase equipment such as tables and chairs, tools and signage, laptops and printers, lawnmowers, canopies and training equipment.



Healthy Ireland

Tipperary County Council is a proud partner of Healthy Ireland framework which is a government led initiative aimed at improving the health and wellbeing of everyone living in Ireland. There are four national goals within the framework:

- Increase the proportion of people who are healthy at all stages of life
- Reduce health inequalities
- Protect the public from threats to health and wellbeing
- Create an environment where every sector of society can play their part

The Tipperary Local Community Development Committee have developed 'A Strategy for a Healthy Tipperary 2018 – 2020' the aim being to develop interagency actions based on local, county and national priority programmes. This is overseen by the Healthy Tipperary Steering Group which consists of partner organisations across the county and chaired by the HSE.

Activities currently supported by Healthy Tipperary across the county are Traveller Mental Health; Dementia Understand Together; Tipperary Active Bodies; 'Make the Moove: Farmers Matter'; Active Tots in Tipp; Healthy Relationships; Healthy Weaning Workshops; Mind Body and Soul Youth Promotion Programme; Non Violent Resistance and TLC Kidz programme; Social Farming and Tipperary LGBTI Youth Strategic Support Programme. We have a further regional activity with other counties regarding Tobacco Free; Positive Aging and Healthy Food Made Easy. There have also been several activities for Community Mental Health in the county.

This complements Tipperary Libraries 'Healthy Ireland at Your Library' programme which includes a special books collection, online health resources and talks, discussions and workshops with a focus on physical health, mental health and health literacy. Information can be found at:

COMING SOON

Social prescribing offers GPs and other health professionals a means of referring people to a range of non-clinical community supports which can have significant benefits for their overall health and wellbeing.

Social prescribing generally involves three key components

- · A referral from a healthcare professional,
- · Consultation with a Social prescribing link worker
- An agreed referral to a local community activity. Examples include; art, cookery, meditation, GAA, men's sheds, music, drama, walking groups and many more.

Social prescribing can also enable and support people to access health services such as Smoking Cessation, Self-management support programmes and others.

Clonmel Community Resource Centre will be hosting the social prescribing service funded through Slaintecare Healthy Communities Initiative and will be developing over the next few months and further details to follow in due course.

Tipperary Studies Digitisation Website reaches 200,000 hits!

On Monday, 18th January 2021, staff at Tipperary County Council Library Service commenced an ambitious project to digitise the Poor Law Minute Books in their collection, which embraced the Great Famine era, 1839 to 1852. This was achieved and the site went live on Friday 28th May 2020 when it was launched by Cllr Michael Smith at Nenagh Library. Other collections were added throughout 2021, including a collection of 399 digitised glass plate negatives, embracing much of Tipperary, from the late 1930s; Dog Licence registers; images from the Holycross Show and the Sharkey Photograph Album collection. On the anniversary of the commencement of the digitisation of the Poor Law Union digitisation project, the counter on the Tipperary Studies Digital website www.tippstuidesdigital.ie went over the 200,000 mark for hits on the site since Monday 3rd May 2021.



First 5 Little Library

Through the First 5 Little Library initiative, libraries provide book bags to Early Learning and Care and School Age Childcare Services to support children's early language and literacy development. All Early Learning and Care (ELC) and School-Age Childcare (SAC) services in Co. Tipperary were invited to collect a First 5 Little Library book bag from their local library. The First 5 Little Libraries book bags contain books chosen by librarians and materials developed to support storytelling and reading with children. The focus of this initiative is to support early language and literacy development among children and build strong links between ELC and SAC services and libraries. The project is a collaboration between the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth (DCEDIY), the Department of Rural and Community Development (DRCD) and the Local Government Management Agency (LGMA).

- Develop the attitude and skills needed to write competitive grant proposals successfully.
- How to manage the challenges of writing a successful grant application.
- Gain competence in writing typical grant components, including a statement of need, implementation strategies, monitoring & evaluation, classify outcomes & impact, budget attachments, and an executive summary.

TIPPERARY CREATIVE IRELAND GRANT SCHEMES 2022

Tipperary Creative Ireland Grant Schemes are now open- there are two distinct schemes.

1. Community Grant Scheme

Who can apply:

This grant scheme is open to community groups and not for profit

organisations, arts, heritage and cultural groups, venues and societies to support creative projects. Applications by individuals must be in partnership with a community, cultural or heritage group.

What Funding is available:

The level of grant assistance for any one project will range from €500 to €3,000.

To be eligible projects must

- take place in County Tipperary
- be organised by an individual/community/voluntary group based in Tipperary
- encourage or benefit participation in the Creative Ireland programme and enhance the awareness of culture in the local area.
- be in keeping with at least one of the five pillars of the Creative Ireland Programme especially Pillar 2: Enabling creativity in every community.
- be accessible to diverse audiences and participants and will be inclusive in theme and approach
- be designed on a realistic financial basis and provide good value for money

2. Tipperary Creative Ireland Open Call Grant Scheme

The overall aim of this call is to instigate high quality cultural activity and collaborative projects that encourage greater creativity and access to and appreciation of arts, culture and heritage. Projects can be small, medium or large and should involve a community/ group or clearly benefit the wider community. The Call is to encourage new, ambitious and meaningful collaborations between creators/practitioners and communities. Projects that engage directly with a community group are especially welcome.

Funding available is between €3000 and €15,000.

What is Eligible:

Your project must

- Take place in County Tipperary
- Be relevant to the Creative Ireland Strategy
- Engage with the community

Closing date for applications is 4pm on Friday 11th February 2022.
