2. Tipperary Bealtaine 2022 Call Out; Renew and Grow

Each year in the month of May, Bealtaine is presented as an annual nationwide festival celebrating the arts and creativity as we age. The festival is an initiative of Age & Opportunity, the national organisation that promotes active and engaged living as we get older.

Tipperary County Council runs an extensive, interactive programme throughout the county and in recent times, has taken the lead in programming the festival with our partner Tipperary Libraries, inviting artists to become involved.

For the 2022 Bealtaine programme, we are taking a different approach through issuing an open call to Tipperary artists to become involved. This open call, with a deadline of 8th December, invites artists to submit a written proposal around themes of renewal and growth. The Covid-19 pandemic and in particular its impact on older people, has underlined the natural and human ecosystem of dependence and connection. Based on the experiences of the past 20 months and in light of the fact that 2022 marks a particularly significant year in our nation's history, we see opportunities for all of us to renew ourselves and the world around us, and to grow, personally and in strength of connection to each other.

We would like to hear from professional artists, from across all artforms. To date the Bealtaine Festival has comprised exhibitions, concerts, dance, storytelling, theatre productions, choral events, tours to and residencies in care settings, workshops and writer's events – the emphasis is on engaging older people as both makers and audiences for the arts. We have worked with care settings, Active Retired, resident's associations, libraries, book clubs, choirs, Men's Sheds, ICA etc. – any organisations in which older people are active or which work with older people. Artists with whom we have worked in the past are invited to engage with this process as a way of renewing and reinvigorating their own practice.

We are keen to engage with artists in a new way and we are open to new collaborations. Artists who wish to respond to this open call will be required to demonstrate that they have already engaged with older people in relation to the concept or idea and/or that they have identified a particular context or physical setting in which older people can actively participate in the proposed project.

The artists selected will work closely with the older people whether in presenting or creating work.

The funding available to each project will range from €1000 to €5000 depending on size, scale and reach of the proposal.

Health & Safety Information: All potential health and safety risks must be fully considered and addressed for all Bealtaine events. Events must take place in accordance with current government health guidelines as well as Tipperary Arts Office's own Health & Safety policies.

The application process is simple:

Tell us about yourself and your practice (attach CV)

Why are you interested in working with older people?

Where / in what setting do you propose to work? Have you already made contact with the setting and can you provide a letter of support from the setting confirming this?

What do you propose to do and how will you respond to the themes set out above?

When will your project commence? Bealtaine runs throughout the month of May, residencies may commence in advance of this date

Please provide a budget in support of your proposal

Note – if successful, you will be required to provide publicity materials to support the promotion of the project and your work by 25th February 2022. Cognisant of the fact that projects won't have commenced at that stage, we would ask for past samples of your work or work in which you are currently involved.

The assessment process will take place before 31st December 2021 and you will be informed of the outcome of this process also in that timeframe.

3. FRESH INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL 28th March—2nd April 2022

Founded in 1997 as the Irish School's Video Competition, Fresh Film was originally a schools competition for secondary students. It has since grown into a year round organisation with a focus on national and international filmmakers spanning the primary and secondary age groups. 'Fresh International Film Festival' now includes 'Ireland's Young Filmmaker of the Year Awards `, which constitute three sections – Junior (7-12 years) – Senior (12- 18 years) – The International (7-19 years). Each section is open to individual filmmakers, schools, youth and community groups.

Fresh Film runs programmes throughout the year under five headings; Fresh Events, Fresh Education, Fresh International, Fresh Production and Fresh International Film Festival.

5. Cruinniú na nÓg 2022

Open Call for Strategic Partners in the delivery of Cruinniú na nÓg 2022

The Creative Ireland Programme is seeking to further develop, diversify and expand the offering and audience for Cruinniú na nÓg in 2022.

Cruinniú na nÓg is Ireland's national day of free creative activity for children and young people up to 18 years of age. Over the past 3 years it has become a key date in Ireland's cultural calendar, providing opportunities for Ireland's 1.2 million children and young people, to be inquisitive and curious, to be inventive and innovative, and to fulfil a creative ambition or showcase an inner creative talent. In 2022, Cruinniú na nÓg will take place on Saturday 11th June.

The Creative Ireland Programme is therefore inviting applications from organisations who have a demonstrable capacity to deliver Cruinniú na nÓg audience scalability nationwide through the provision of free creative activities for children and young people. Specifically this call for applications seeks to;

- collaborate with strategic partners in the delivery of this national day of creativity for children and young people as a key cultural event in 2022;
- increase the choice of creative activity, across a wide genre, available to children and young people and in particular harder to reach young people;
- deliver creative engagement opportunities either in-person or online (in accordance with prevailing public health guidance) to a large-scale audience online and/or in multiple locations throughout the country; and
- foster collaborations and synergies between the activities of strategic partners and local authority Culture and Creativity Teams in relevant areas.
- we are open to projects that connect with the young diaspora abroad via our collaboration with Department of Foreign Affairs.

6. Public Art Commission for Irishtown village, County Mayo.











Funded through the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage under the Per Cent for Art Scheme.

Mayo County Council in collaboration with Irishtown Community Council invite artist(s) to submit proposals for a public art commission for the community of Irishtown in County Mayo. This commission is an exciting opportunity for an artist(s) to work in a historic village with a strong community spirit. Proposals are welcome from both individuals and collaborative artistic teams. The budget for this commission is €14,000. This commission is part of Mayo County Council's Public Art Programme, funded by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage under the Per Cent for Art Scheme. The purpose of the percent for art scheme is to commission artists to create new work. Proposed outcomes can be ephemeral, temporary or semi-permanent in a nature.

The village of Irishtown (Baile Gaelach) is located in the south of county Mayo along the R328 regional road close to the Galway and Roscommon borders. The area has a rich history associated with Michael Davitt, the Land League and the famine. There is an active community who have been instrumental in developing the local amenities and activities in the village.

2. "Boat Light" exhibition by Nenagh artist Josephine Geaney at Nenagh Arts Centre this November

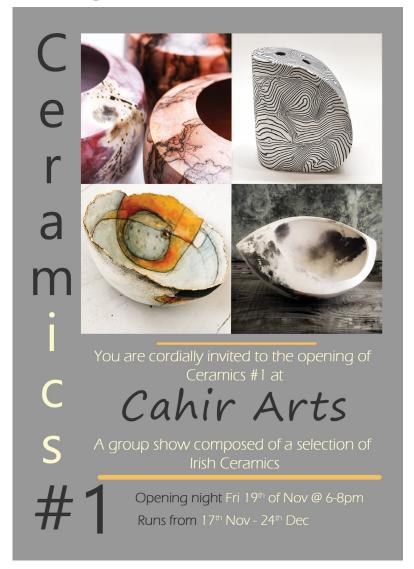


"Boat Light" by artist Josephine Geaney showing at Nenagh Arts Centre this November.
