4.	<p><u>SICAP</u></p> <p>NTDC SICAP Update on Progress to date 2020</p> <p>Michael Murray spoke about the NTDC SICAP Progress to date 2020 under the two Goals, Supporting Community Groups and Supporting Individuals. Michael advised that there are 40 Community Groups which were identified through the Deprivation index and were mostly based in Local Authority Housing Estates. He explained that some have residential groups already established and others don't but that the aim would be to build capacity within the groups to deal with issues as they arise. There has been considerable work done with Men's Sheds and Direct Provision Centres and designated project officers allocate time and support to these groups. Michael also spoke about Age Action and the roll out to areas such as Toomevara, Nenagh and Thurles. He spoke about collaborations with the PPN and the Tipperary Volunteer Centre. He outlined details of work in conjunction with Social Enterprise such as mentoring support and grant application assistance. Michael also spoke about the implications of Covid and explained that some of the initiatives had not progressed as much as they had hoped but Covid support has been given to groups such as Meals on Wheels and Food Banks as well as Wellness packs and Cocooning Packs which had been distributed to the vulnerable. Michael spoke about various actions under Goal 2 such as Learning for Life, Personal Development, Youth Community Development and the Enterprise Support and Job Seekers, Work Plan and Career Support. It was acknowledged that the focus going forward will be to provide support for people going back to work after the Covid Crisis.</p> <p>Sean O'Farrell asked if there could be linkages to all the services through the PPN Website and Michael agreed that it is something that could be looked at.</p> <p>Cllr. Joe Hannigan congratulated Michael for the vast amount of work which has been done to date and members agreed.</p> <p>Mid Year Check Process</p> <p>Margo told the meeting that the SICAP midyear review would take place after Wednesday the 14th of July, the review documents must be uploaded to IRIS by that date. Margo said that when the relevant documentation is up on IRIS she would circulate them to the sub-group. Margo also confirmed that due to the pandemic that payments will on this occasion be made available before reviews are carried out.</p>

5.3 To approve Monthly Income and Expenditure Report

The LEADER Income and Expenditure for June 2020 was approved on the proposal of Imelda Walsh and Seconded by Martin Quinn.

Shane went through the report in detail and agreed to forward the report to the members after the meeting. Shane also advised that the LAGS are in the top 5 in the Country in terms of applications received and grants paid out. Joe asked if there was scope to move funds between themes and Shane advised that themes could be realigned.

5.4 Any Other Matters/Updates

Discussion took place around some Economic projects not potentially progressing therefore giving rise to an opportunity cost for other promoters. Given the current impact of Covid-19 many

promoters may not be in a position to secure match funding or have demand for expansion. Members asked if the LAG Manager could approve projects at earlier stages knowing that a Budget is not in place as an exception to normal practice.

Charles advised that this was something that had been agreed in the past. Shane agreed to get back to the members with clarification on this. This was proposed by Cllr. Joe Hannigan and seconded by Charles Stanley Smith.

Charles spoke about the implications if CAP goes into a one or two year transition and Isabel advised that they would be anxious to keep the 5% Rural Development programme within CAP. Imelda advised that there will have to be funding to allow projects to continue. Members voiced concerns that when CAP finishes at the end of 2020 that there will be a time gap. Pat agreed to raise the issue at the Chief Officers of Quarterly LCDC meeting with the Department. Joe suggested that a motion be brought to the full council meeting seeking that funding would be made available to fill the time gap and John agreed that he would speak with Joe in relation to this motion.

5.5 A.O.B.

Sean asked for further information on the following Initiatives/Projects

Catalyst Ireland Wales Project. He said he was very pleased with this optimization programme which was set up as an opportunity for Carlow and Tipperary businesses in the Food and Drink sector to look into a sustainable future with EU funded programme. Sean asked if the information could be put up on the PPN website. Fiona agreed to forward information on the initiative to all LCDC Committee Members.

Sean also asked if the members might be able to get more information on the Training initiative between LAWPRO and the various stakeholders and communities around Water and also if these initiatives could be promoted through Tipperary PPN. Fiona agreed to get back to Sean on this.

Sean spoke about the EU Smart Villages Network Programme and asked if there was more information and also if he could get more information on upcoming initiatives. Fiona agreed to forward information to the LCDC Members. Michael Murray also agreed to forward documentation of Committee Members on the EU Smart Villages Network Programme after the meeting.

'Just Transition' Report and Commencement of the EU Start Engagement Process

Pat referred to the 'Just Transition' Report which had been

	<p>circulated to the members before the meeting. This report relates to the closure of Bord na Mona in the Midlands. Pat advised that there has been €11,000,000 funding allocated for various projects including the setting up of programmes through the ETB to create new employment opportunities for the workers. An example of this would be the hub in Roscrea and the Sabina recycling plastic plant in Littleton. Pat also referred to the bogs at Littleton and that it is hoped that an application for funding for walks etc. would be launched which would see walkways created between 10 bogs. The cost of this project would be 5 or 6 million but funding would be applied for in phases.</p>
<p>7.</p>	<p><u>DRCD Grant Schemes Update – CLAR, Town and Village Renewal and ORIS</u></p> <p>Shane outlined details of the various schemes which are operating within the Clar Areas including the Meals and Wheels & Linked Services which can be used for the purpose of adaption of existing vehicles or the purchase of equipment directly required for the provision of meals on wheels. Also the Mobility & Cancer Care Transport grant which can be used to cover the cost of a vehicle or fit out a vehicle. This funding will only be available to applicants who demonstrate that the majority (over 80%) of their normal population reside within CLAR DED's.</p> <p>Also under the Town and Village Strands funding is available for interventions that can respond to the new challenges associated with COVID-19 and support the economic and social recovery of our rural towns and villages. He highlighted that the scheme was open for expressions of Interest under two strands; the mainstream similar to other years and a new accelerated measure which requires the project to be completed by the end of the year.</p> <p>CLAR Measure 2 Outdoor recreational Areas (Areas where people can socialise outdoors in safe community spaces) was open for expressions of interest. The Council can submit 10 CLAR projects in total this year between measure 1 safety measures and measure 2, this year we have agreed 4 measure 2's will be submitted and 6 measure 1's.</p> <p>In total 15 applications were received and will be shortlisted over the next day or so.</p>
<p>8.</p>	<p><u>Healthy Ireland Update</u></p> <p>Fiona advised the meeting that new guidance has been received from Pobal in relation to actions for the future. The issues addressed under the new regulations are in relation to funding and actions being delivered but in a different way as we enter Phase 2 of the governments roadmap. Public Health Advise and Stay Safe guidelines have been issued. Fiona advised that The joint DOH, HSE campaign continues to give mental health and wellbeing</p>

	<p>advice across the country and local authorities through Health Ireland are also rolling it out on a regional basis. Fiona also referred to other resources/campaigns such as a new National Bereavement Support Line and the Study which the HSE has launched to investigate COVID-10 Infection in people living in Ireland.
